NOTES FROM THE POLICE STATION

During the month of June of this year, the Police Co. had 18 men for discharge. Of this number four were discharged with the recommendation that they were not suitable for re-enlistment, while of the remaining fourteen, thirteen were re-enlisted and one extended for one year. All of which goes to show that the life of a policeman has its advantages.

The Policia Urbana have been increased to fourteen men by the addition of four on the first of the month. It is hoped that this number will again be increased on the first of July.

M I S C E L L A N E O U S

The following is a copy of a telegram sent to the President of Nicaragua by the Honorable Señor Jose Francisco Moncada, Jefe Politico of Nueva Segovia, during his recent visit to the District of Totogalpa:

" Totogalpa, Nicaragua.

Telegram to the Comandante General,
Presidential House,
To the Minister of Gobernacion,
Managua, Nicaragua.

I have arrived in this town in company of the Área Commander, Northern Area, Colonel Hunt, and have seen a wonderful spectacle of tranquility and peace. Lieutenant Livermore, Jefe of the Guardia in this town, had prepared a review of more than 600 men, many of whom had been members of the groups of bandits under Ortez and Umanzor. Notwithstanding that it goes slow, is being established in a definite manner as it is proved by this demonstration of sympathy and willingness of the people in favor of the Government. I incited the people to continue cultivating their love for peace, order and law, as they are the only sources of richness which might enlarge our country. Lieutenant Livermore has made of this town not only a military post, but also a diplomatic post, the bandits by and by becoming good citizens. The people awoke this day shouting "vivas" with enthusiasm for the President of the Republic the Guardia Nacional and for Colonel Hunt - Respectfully - Jose Francisco Moncada, Jefe Politico of Nueva Segovia."

The following are extracts from the "MONTHLY RECORD OF EVENTS" of the Central Area, Commanded by Colonel J.C.Smith, G.N., for the month of June, 1931:

GENERAL STATE OF TERRITORY OCCUPIED: Unsettled due to banditry. The group that took part in the contact at Embocaderos were evidently in search of clothing and food and came from the north. All reports indicate that this group split up after the contact and returned north.

MILITARY SITUATION: During the period preparations were being made to establish a post at Embocaderos. As soon as enough men are available this will be done and it is believed that together with Corinto Finch the area along the Tuma River will be thoroughly cleaned up.

ECONOMIC SITUATION: Continues subnormal. Food staples are very scarce and high. During the last two weeks of this period corn and beans could not be purchased. Reports of people hoarding food by orders of the bandits were investigated and found to be false. It is believed that within a month this situation will be straightened out and staples will again become normal.

WEATHER: Very wet.

FRICITION BETWEEN GUARDIA AND CIVIL POPULATION: None.

POLITICAL SITUATION: Normal.

CONDITION OF ROADS AND TRAILS: Bad. With the continuous rains the roads and trails have become very muddy and the rivers have become very difficult to cross.

The following are extracts from the "MONTHLY RECORD OF EVENTS" of the Department of Leon, commanded by Major J.W. Webb, G.N., for June, 1931:

GENERAL STATE OF TERRITORY OCCUPIED: Reports were received that there were bandit groups in the vicinity of Santa Rosa and El Jicaral during the month. These reports were investigated by patrols and it was found that there were no groups in that territory. Small groups of thieves operated in the vicinity of Leon during the month.

MILITARY SITUATION: There are no bandit groups operating in the Department of Leon. Small bands of robbers are roaming throughout the vicinity of the city of Leon. The continued operation of robber groups may be expected until the economic conditions improve.

ECONOMIC CONDITIONS: The economic conditions in the Department continue in a state of depression. Food-stuffs are high in price and scarce. The new crop of corn is rapidly maturing and conditions will improve with its harvest.

RELATION BETWEEN GUARDIA AND CIVIL POPULATION: There is no friction between the Guardia and civil population. The civil attitude is friendly but there is a woeful lack of inclination on the part of the civil population to furnish the Guardia with information. The press attitude is friendly.

POLITICAL SITUATION: There is much activity on the part of the candidates for the office of Alcalde of Leon. The leading candidates are Mr. Jose Padilla Paiz and Mr. Absalon Rojas.

WEATHER: There has been an abundance of rain during the month.

ROADS AND TRAILS: The roads and trails are very muddy and travel over them is slow and difficult. Rivers are running high and their passage after a heavy rain is impossible.

RECORD OF THE MONTHLY REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE 1931:
Colonel L. P. Hunt, G.N., for the month of June 1931:

GENERAL STATE OF TERRITORY OCCUPIED: Has been generally quiet. Very few movements of bandit groups were observed during the past month; bandit activities for the most part being confined to the CUJE and ACHUAPA (Esteli) areas..

ECONOMIC CONDITIONS: Continue abnormal in the entire area, but in several districts there is considerable improvement over the conditions obtaining during the month of May. Red Cross supplies have been distributed under the supervision of the Guardia, and many districts green corn and beans are now available.

RELATION BETWEEN GUARDIA AND CIVIL POPULATION: Civil attitude towards the Guardia continue excellent. No friction exists between the Guardia personnel and the law abiding civil population.

POLITICAL SITUATION: Quiet.

WEATHER: Frequent heavy rains.

ROADS AND TRAILS: Very muddy. Rivers high.

The following is reported by Captain R. Arnett, G.N., Commanding the Department of Esteli for the month of June 1931:

Food has been very scarce throughout the Department and the people have been without means to purchase. Officers throughout the Department are daily giving small amounts to the poor to buy food. The Red Cross supplies have arrived and it is a Godsend to them. Reports from the entire department indicate a big crop of corn and beans this year. Harvesting of the crop should start about the end of July.

Red Cross corn was received in El Saucce and the following distribution made of same under the constant escort patrolling of the Guardia who saw that all was delivered without mishap.

Patrol arrived in vicinity of house at 1200. The house was situated on a knoll with woods on either sides and a clearing of some sixty yards at either end. I split the patrol sending the Sergeant with the right wing and myself taking the left, attempting to advance on the house and surrounding it without being seen. The patrol was some forty or fifty yards from the house when a woman from the right side of the house screamed (ya viene la Guardia) when she screamed that a man ran out of the house at the end where I was trying to gain; he was challenged by me and also by some of the guardia but refused to stop. He was wearing a red handkerchief around his neck and it was later discovered a red and black band around his hat. About ten shots were fired before he fell, and just about that time fire was opened on the other side of the house. After the patrol had gained the immediate vicinity of the house my Sergeant reported that two men had attempted to escape and when challenged would not stop, and they opened fire on them, killing both.

There were two women in the vicinity but they refused to talk more than to say that the other three Granados had left that morning, but did not know where they had gone. They also gave the names of the dead as follows: Pedro Granados, who was about eighteen or nineteen years of age, Francisco Granados, about twenty two or three years of age, both wearing red handkerchiefs, and Florentin Gadea, who looked to be in the twenties. I ordered the dead buried and after making a thorough search of the vicinity without finding any traces that a small group had been there as was rumored. The following weapons and articles were captured:

- 1 Con Con rifle, serviceable but in very bad condition, and loaded with one round.
- 1 Escopeta (shotgun), 4 hats, with red and black hat bands.
- 5 red handkerchiefs.
- 1 Guardia blanket.

June 26 left San Andros at 7:00 A.M., went through Linas, Laguna and arrived Daraili at 3:00 P.M. where I camped over night. June 27 left Daraili at 8:30 A.M., went through Santa Rosa, Aguacato, Zapote and Tabacal where I camped over night. Upon arrival at this last place found one Jose Maria Olivas in the same house that I stayed at, equipped with a cutacha and a service bayonet, also rod and black hat band on his hat and credentials from Miguel Angel Ortega Guillen, who was killed next day June 28, 1931 when he tried to get away from the patrol at river crossing at Valle de Las Iglesias. June 28 left Tabacal at 7:00 am., went through Valle de Las Iglesias and arrived Palacaguina at 2:00 pm. where I camped overnight. June 29 left Palacaguina at 8:00 am., with combined patrol from said station. Lt Kipp and eight enlisted had contact at Alteca with group of twenty (jefe Unanzen) destroyed camp, captured two bombs, three cutachas, correspondence and miscellaneous articles, killed two and wounded several. Returned to Esperanza and camped over night. From here Lt. Kipp went to Palacaguina. June 30 left Esperanza at 7:30 am., went through Cusmaji and Concepcion where I confiscated one shotgun several detonators small quantity of powder ten rounds of Springfield .30 ammunition and rod and black hat bands. Captured one Gilberto Muñoz (no relation of mine) arrived at Zapote at 3:30 pm. where I camped over night.

July 1 left Zapote at 6.30 am. and arrived Tolpaneca at 9:00 am.
